    - 4. Diagnostics (laboratory, radiology, cardiology, others)
    - 5. Medical decision-making pearls
    - 6. Diagnosis
    - 7. Initial treatment (staying relevant to the urgent care setting)
    - 8. Disposition treatment
    - 9. Prevention (if relevant)
    - 10. Disposition management, referral rules, and transfer rules
    - 11. Follow-up (again, relevant to the urgent care setting)
