

DEVELOPING DATA

n each issue on this page, we report on research from or relevant to the emerging urgent care marketplace. This month, we offer another look at data from the most recent annual survey conducted by UCAOA. (In early 2008, UCAOA revamped its annual survey in conjunction with researchers at Massachusetts General Hospital and Harvard University, with the goal of assuring that the UCAOA Benchmarking Committee's efforts produced a scientifically valid report.)

In this issue: What time do U.S. urgent care centers tend to open for business each day?

OPEN FOR BUSINESS Sunday* Saturday -9 a.m. or after 8 - 8:59 a.m. Before 8 a.m. Weekdays -60 10 20 0 30 40 50

Compared with past UCAOA surveys, these data show that more centers are opening their doors before 9 a.m. on weekends (presumably before most other physician offices are open) than in years past, but that weekday opening times are relatively stable.
